Trinity-tide greetings to all our friends and supporters of the IAF.

2024 began this year with a generous gift from the Anglican Church in America that helped "balance our books" and gave us a great start toward fulfilling our current year mission grant allocations.

Also, in early spring, several of our members came through with substantial gifts that enabled the IAF to expand its outreach into several key designated ministries.

Among the designated ministries were the Farsi Mission Church project in Indonesia and the Thailand mission church to Pakistani refugees in Bangkok, Thailand.

The designated grant system supported by the IAF has become a mainstay for many hundreds of Anglicans around the world.

It is our hope that we will expand this program even further this year, as other churches and denominations have indicated their desire to make use of the IAF to help fund their own mission churches in the third world.

This issue of "The Mission" focuses on a new mission we are considering, which is an Anglican Church of Somali refugees currently relocated in the country of Uganda. We give special thanks to ACA Bishop Robert Hammond of Diocese of the West (DOW) for connecting us to this worthwhile missionary enterprise.

As many are aware, there is a growing tendency in many third world countries to persecute Christians and Christian organizations of all denominations. Persecution of the Church occurs every day in China, Iran, Afghanistan, Angola, Somalia, India, Nepal, Nigeria, Nicaragua, Venezuela, Oman and Saudi Arabia. Persecution of the Anglican Church is no exception to this horror, especially in Nigeria, where 8,000,000 of

the world's Anglicans reside.

Lately, there are some groups we've encountered that are so persecuted that they cannot publicly identify themselves, or their needs, and must be assisted in secret. If you wish to help the persecuted church with a donation to the IAF, you can designate your check as 'persecuted' in the remarks area. Upon receipt, I will be happy to send you a report of where in the world your funds have gone to support this important form of world mission outreach.

Please Pray for persecuted Christians and the persecuted church each week—and remember also The International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church on Sunday November 3, 2024


Generosity and a desire to be a part of something that helps to fill a real need have resulted in a sustained growth of our Anglican Fellowship.

Report to the IAF from DEANERY OF INDONESIA BY Fr. James Long

November was an exciting month as I was able to attend as the consecration of the new seminary chapel and the ordination of twelve men to the priesthood, including our assistant pastor Hermawan. Providence Anglican Church, Jakarta has hosted six short term mission teams from Hong Kong and China who helped with both the refugee ministry and our outreach to the many poor living under bridges in Jakarta. The Sunday after the ordination our Afghani pastor led the liturgy, our Scottish preaching trainee, read Scripture, In preached and our newly minted priest celebrated Holy Communion. The multiplication of ministers is one of God's many blessings, and we are especially grateful for a donation that came in from a friend in the Reformed Episcopal Church, that paid fully half of the tuition for our Afghani student at St. Bede's! Please pray for us as we look into a new government program that may allow us to bring some of our Afghani members to work and study in the States. The potential of such men to expand the ACA's domestic work to include churches for Iranian and Afghani immigrants is something for us all to pray toward.



Renting this unit 7 days a week allows PAC to open a children's outreach in this huge apartment and shopping complex. The members have taken great care in the renovation and decoration of this room.

Just before COVID a young woman from Red China was invited to a PAC outreach during her last day on a Bali vacation. There God began to open her heart. Here, three years later, she and her mother donated their vacation to working at Ruma Baca, a related ministry that serves the village children of Bali through literacy development and the sharing of the good news.

DESIGNATED MISSION TO SOMALI REFUGEES

Dear IAF Members—the IAF has accepted Pastor Manasseh's work as a desginated mission. Please read his story below:

My name is Manasseh Kenyi, I am 53 years old married with 6 kids. I was born in South Sudan 1971 went through primary school under Anglican Church of South Sudan after my primary studies I went on and joined Juba University in South Sudan where I completed my first degree. After I went to Nairobi Kenya where I studied masters at the African international university in 2008.

In April 2016 there was a break-out of War in South Sudan which erupted and most people fled to northern Uganda and have remained refugees there to date. I insisted on ministering faithfully in Yei until it became a near ghost town which forced me with my family to flee to Adjumani town in northern Uganda becoming refugees in December, 2017.

In June 2018, I planted a church called "Yenet Worship Centre" in the Adjumani town vicinity which is mainly attended by South Sudanese refugees living in the town and its outskirts. We requested, and got permitted by the Government Local Council I Chairman to allow the Christians use of their small meeting hall for worship every Sunday on a temporary basis.

The Yenet Worship Centre (YWC) is a congregation of the Anglican Church in a refugee centre in Northern Uganda. Most of the Soth Sudanese Refugee community living in Adjumani Town worship in this centre. Since its opening, the number of Christians attending Sundays in this Centre has grown, In the first year after we opened the new church plant, it grew from 46 members to 240

believers! Many of the community visitors come from places within 10kms or more to worship in the Yenet Worship Cen-

tre. We have two worship services and the first is an English service mainly attended by youths and the second is a vernacular service attended mainly by adult Christians. More than 300 people have made personal decisions for Christ and many have engaged in discipleship training. In addition, Adjumani district has 18 refugee settlements and a population of 303,671 refugees published in 2019 according to United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees

As a theologically trained Pastor, my passion is to continue serving the Lord Jesus Christ so that many people become Christians and to teach, nurture and mentor them in to mature and good future leaders. Without an adequate means of transportation, I cannot do much for the thousands of South Sudanese refugees within Adjumani. Pastor Doug was able to connect with a pastor friend whose church provided the funding for a new motor Vehicle which helps me in many ways to serve God up to date.

Again, we appreciate Pastor Doug Swank, who along with his wife and several friends, have provided minimal monthly support of \$300. We started with 10 Refugees but now our foundation holds 150 refugees. See photos.

We teach the children the word of God plus a normal education so that they can became better people in the future. But we don't have supporters that can help us on this yet. We are looking for other friends and together with Pastor Doug Swank for the betterment of these refugees because every school term they need School fees, Books, Shoes, Uniforms among other items, so your positive response on this is well appreciated. Now Pastor Doug Swank promised me to reach out to his church in the US to see if they can include me as one of their missionaries. Thank you, Bellevue Heights Church, for your consideration of including me as one of your missionaries.

The IAF Sustaining Member program was begun in 2012 as a tool to formally recognize those churches and individuals that support the Fellowship on a recurring basis. For example, if one of the line items in a church budget contains a donation to the IAF, that church is eligible to

become a Sustaining Member. Similarly, individuals or families who desire to provide support on a regular basis can be recognized as Sustaining Members.

This program helps to give the IAF Board of Directors an idea of how to plan distribution of donated funds for Traditional Anglican Church missionary projects and to target those projects that are most in need.
